**Semester One:** January/February – June

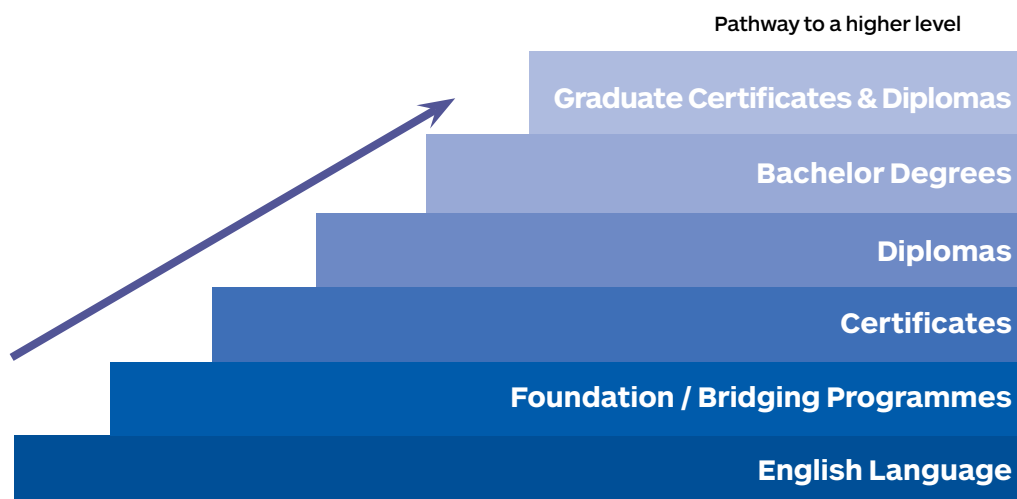
**Semester Two:** July – November/December
